The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board provided the following data for the 2010 Schreiner University cohort of graduates who were employment and/or enrolled in the 4th quarter of 2010. The employment rate was 88%.

Program data and follow-up surveys reflected:

- 61 % of the graduates had jobs within 2 months of graduation with 8 having jobs by graduation and 6 more within 2 months.
- 5 students held positions in acute care with hospital nursing; 9 in long-term care in nursing homes and 1 in drug/alcohol rehab center.
- 1 student had moved out of state and 3 had only recently applied for a job and were waiting to hear from the prospective employers.
