 1 a. **Summary of Assessment Data Collected:** EXSI 3321 – 75% of students earned C or better on the biomechanical analysis. EXSI 4323 – 89% earned C or better on the error analysis. EXSI 2305 – 84% earned C or better on the technical demonstration.
